assignment of your rights in the work, and you never authorized anyone else to do it on your behalf, then you likely have a valid claim for copyright infringement against those who are using and profiting from your work without your permission.

My advice would be to consult with a <u>copyright litigator</u> in your jurisdiction to discuss the specific facts of your situation and the options available to you to enforce the copyright in your works. A copyright litigator should be able to advise you on your best course of action in this matter, and then you should be in a position to decide how to proceed.
